Introduction

Prerequisites and Expectations

- 1. Review and familiarize yourself with the Citizenship in The Nation Merit Badge book (2010 version or newer).
- 2. Complete the following requirements prior to arrival at Mackinac Island. <u>See further instructions described for each requirement in the Citizenship in the Nation Worksheet</u>. Bring all completed requirements to Mackinac Island.
 - #2(a) Mackinac Island as a national historic landmark exploration requirement.
 - #2(d) Father Marquette National Memorial exploration requirement.
 - #3 Important National Issues requirement.
 - #6 President Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address requirement.
 - #8 Voice your opinion requirement.
- 3. Bring paper, pens, pencils, and a copy of the Citizenship in the Nation Worksheet to the island.
- 4. Feel free to complete any other requirements on your own prior to arrival at the island (encouraged but not required).
