Troop 314 Events Completed in February 2019:

Camp Blue Jay @ Ortega Falls Feb 23rd - 24th

Lots of water! No rope climbing.

We wanted to camp somewhere that we could do some rock climbing, and since Ortega Falls is just a short drive from home and has a noreservations campground nearby, it seemed like a good choice. But we knew that there was a chance that the falls would be flowing so heavily that the climbing walls would be entirely too wet, but at least we would get some camping in.

The drive up Ortega Highway was very scenic, with all the greenery and we decided to stop at the falls before going on to Blue Jay Campground. As soon as we reached the parking area, we realized that the falls must really be flowing, because it was crowded! People were coming out to see the falls, much like they come out to see poppy blooms.

The creek was indeed flowing strongly, and the falls were more vigorous than I have ever seen them. Boys always like flowing creeks and waterfalls, so they, and I, had fun rock-hopping around the area before we headed back to the car.



Blue Jay Campground is located 2.5 miles off of Ortega Highway, far enough that you can't hear the highway traffic at all, and it is quite peaceful (at least in the off-season, as this was). The campground was far from full (I'd guess about 1/4 capacity), so we had our pick of sites.

There was still snow on the ground in patches, so some of the boys actually built a small snowman!




There was enough grass without snow to pitch our tents, so that was not a problem. The site next to us was unoccupied, so the boys made use of the tree stump there to chop firewood.

Since climbing was off the table, we instead went for a little hike, about 3 miles round trip, on the San Juan Trail. The visibility was so great, we could easily see Catalina Island, 50 miles away, and we thought we could also see San Clemente Island, 75 miles distant!

This campout was a little unusual in that every meal was a hot one; chili dogs for lunch, beef stew for dinner, and sausage & egg casserole for breakfast! Yum! The beef stew was made from scratch, not canned, and it was delicious! We should remember that recipe!

We heard coyotes and owls during the night. Overnight the temperature got down to the high 30's, but I heard no complaints about anyone being cold. And a roaring campfire helps! We even had a fire in the morning.

On the drive home, we stopped at the Ortega Candy Store for some treats, which I consider to be a tradition.



If you ask me, camping in the off-season can be the best time, as there are no crowds or bugs. I would like to go back to Blue Jay Campground in the early or late summer, but we may encounter both of the above. We'll see. Anyway, another successful campout. Adults attending: Mr. M, Ian M. - The Third Tuesday meeting includes Board of Reviews for Rank Advancement when not a COH.
- Fourth Tuesday could be for Patrol meetings if you are able to get the Scoutmaster to come early or close late.
- ** No meetings are usually held on 5th Tuesday. These are saved for Fundraisers, or special meetings at interesting locations.

Court of Honor is held 4 times a year, every 3 months usually the last Scout meeting of month (except December). In March and September COH Scouts are honored for their rank advancements with a candle lighting ceremony and parents are given pins.

In June and December, our COH does not have candles and rank advancement pins for parents, but we add a potluck dinner in June – (Optional potluck in Dec.).
